



PE and SPORT GRANT 2017-18

Background

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport, to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Funding has been allocated to all maintained and state funded schools with primary phase pupils from 1st September 2013. A typical primary school receives about £9,250. Funding was be doubled for 2017/18.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Impact

- Year 5 swimming- Year 5's have ensured they have reached their 25m and water confidence with the booster swimming package.
- SSP core package- This ensured that we could take part in the competitions and sports festivals which SSP host. Children were able to take part in inter school competitions and experience new sports throughout the year.
- Level 5 training - This member of staff has completed the training and gained confidence within the subject area. This will then also impact the following years as they can now ensure the level of teaching is consistently high and in line with the school's expectations.
- Physical Literacy Training - This has ensured that children are getting the support they need at a high level so they can develop physically, impacting the level of development across the subject.
- Floor markings- teaching staff were feeding back how line markings would enhance their lessons. This now ensures teaching and learning is improving through the use of the correct markings. Time is also saved as temporary markings don't need to be used during the lesson.

- Equipment- The introduction of more and different equipment has impacted the types of sports which are now taught at the school. Children are exposed to a larger range of sports which are designed to improve the physical development of the children.

Initial plans for the PE budget 2018/19

Money will be spent through the use of Premier Sport's teaching and competition organising. Children will be taught a particular sport and take part in a competition each half term. Throughout these sessions, teachers take part in CPD through the deliverance of the sports and lessons.

Equipment will still be bought and kept up to date and in working order. We feel that this is very important for the children to enable them to take part in different sports and find their particular talents. SEN equipment will also be invested in so all children are able to take part in all sports and achieve their full potential.

CPD is very important at the school and so staff will be sent on courses when needed to ensure the level of teaching and learning is always the best.
